#### 1 Introduction

This is the first all-Wales Annual Pay and Conditions Survey following a collaboration between ACAS (Wales) and Cardiff Business School. Previous pay surveys by both organisations had existed up until 2001. For example, ACAS Wales undertook a survey of the members of their South East Wales Personal Management Groups, and made this available to Group members on a regular basis, with the last survey being undertaken in September 2001. For their part, the Cardiff Business School through Professor Robert McNabb and Dr David Simpson, had conducted pay surveys of the larger organisations in Wales, for, first, Welsh Water and then Hyder, for each year beginning in 1990. However, with the transfer of Hyder to Western Power Distribution, and then onto Glas Cymru, the CBS Pay Survey ended in the year 2,000.

In early 2002, after discussions between ACAS (Wales) and Cardiff Business School, a decision was made to combine the Cardiff Business School Survey which covered all of Wales, with an extended ACAS Survey. This report documents the results of that collaboration, and details pay and conditions information for 240 organisations. The bulk of the information was obtained from the Personnel Management Groups co-ordinated by ACAS (Wales) in their South Wales, West Wales and North Wales Regions, and the analysis was conducted by the Cardiff Business School. The focus of the information contained in this report is the data on pay and salary levels for the 67 occupations included in the Survey, although additional background information is included as noted in section 2.

Each organisation was requested to complete a detailed questionnaire, which is included as an appendix to this Report. In total, 958 questionnaires were distributed and 240 returned; a response rate of 25.1%. The response rates for each of the areas covered in included in Table 1.

#### 2 Data Collected

The data collected focuses on 67 different jobs, seeking information on basic hours of work, average basic weekly or hourly rates of pay or annual salary (excluding overtime and shift premium) and average bonus or commission. In addition, information was collected from each organisation on the level of pay

increase, which, for the organisations covered was 2.92%. The analysis of the pay levels, and bonuses paid, and hours are included later in this report. Information was also collected on the following:

### **3** Coverage of the Survey

Much of the analysis provided below covers all Wales. In addition, information is also provided based on the four ELWa regions, with the North Wales region further divided into North East and North Wales. These are geographically defined as follows:

### South East Wales (SE)

### 4. - Backgroud Information on the Sample.

As well as collecting data on pay levels and conditions, organisations were also asked to provide information about a number of different areas of employment and recruitment to provide useful background labour market data.

### **4a** Shortage Occupations

Organisations were asked in the questionnaire to identify which categories of jobs they have had difficulty in filling. 218 organisations answered this question, and 111, or 50.9% of the sample mentioned at least one category of job, and nearly 100 different job titles were supplied, although there were some differences amongst ELWa areas as follows:

#### 4b Unions Recognised

Organisations were asked to indicate if they recognised a trade union, and, if so, how many. 119 organisations (49.6%) either indicated they did not recognise a trade union, or did not respond to this particular question, which may underestimate the amount of recognition of trade unions. Of the 50.4% of organisations which indicated they recognised at least one trade union, this involved 37 different trade unions, though some organisations recognised more than one union as follows:
