# Background

Recent and ongoing language change

- Sociolinguistics ('variation and change')
- corpus linguistics (e.g. Whitt 2018)
  - culture society language (e.g. Buerki 2020)
  - hist. linguistics & theories of language change
    - Etymology and development of phras. expr. (e.g. Villers 2018)

• semantics of 'in the future'

... while profits plummeted a staggering 71 percent, resulting in Elon Musk on an earning call to confirm that **going forward** he will prioritise Tesla over his White House role at Trump's Department of Government Efficiency (Doge).

... to ensure that they continue to be taxed on the correct share of profits **going forward**.

The solicitor added: "His partner is very unhappy about what he has done. Their priorities **going forward** are the new baby."

2025 – English Trends corpus (Sketch Engine)

• semantics of 'in the future' *not* 'from now on' (break, aspect)

We look forward to continuing to work with them **going forward**.

However, Julian Bray revealed there are some gaps in the aviation industry which authorities need to fix **going forward** .

... we believe Rebel IPA does just that. "Honestly, we think it's set to become the King of Session IPAs **going forward** .

• semantics of 'in the future' *not* compositional

#### '(spacially) advancing' (verbal)

- Glenn is a very experienced player from the south. "He is consistently good going forward and gains us metres.
- With the clocks **going forward** and sunny spring days in sight, Chris Bonnet, founder of GardeningExpress.co.uk has shared his top tips

#### 'go ahead' / 'proceed' (verbal)

- As we see it, if this councillor's vote was void then the plan would not be **going forward** for consultation.
- [Trump] fired off another casual tariff threat Monday even as he told reporters 25 percent tariffs on Canada and Mexico were **going forward** tomorrow.

2025 – English Trends corpus (Sketch Engine)

- semantics of 'in the future'
- Non-finite VP or (sentence) adverbial, clause-initial or final

...this is not what we will tolerate **going forward**.

**Going forward,** it seems that the focus of Etc. will now shift to tackling connectivity problems that many drivers face at EV charging

If successful, the household will not only be due a lower bill going forward, but ...

- semantics of 'in the future'
- Non-finite VP or (sentence) adverbial, clause-initial or final (very occasionally adjectival in NP / adverbial in AdjP)

'We regret to inform all of those who have booked with us that, [...] **all trips going forward** are cancelled ...

I didn't need to worry because "the UK has reached an agreement with the EU which provides certainty about their **rights going forward** ".

Zelensky proposed a new plan to achieve safety for Ukraine going forward.

... the club wished Davids well going forward.

- semantics of 'in the future'
- Non-finite VP or (sentence) adverbial, clause-initial or final
- occurring with tense-marked forms going to / will

we **will** be looking at making a small reduction in core BMW headcount at Plant Swindon **going forward** 

We are going to be more like Dubai going forward, not less like it.

- semantics of 'in the future'
- Non-finite VP or (sentence) adverbial, clause-initial or final
- occurring with tense-marked forms going to / will but also with present & past tense, modals

Going forward, regulation is really needed.


Having access to that was really, really important to me going forward."

- semantics of 'in the future'
- Non-finite VP or (sentence) adverbial, clause-initial or final
- occurring with future tense-marked forms (going to / will), not replacing them

- No full compositionality, fixedness, polylexicality, conventionality
   Words around 10/r
- Usual sequence? MWT, periphrasis, phrasal verb?
- clichéd

Words around 10/m in the BNC:

polish (v) polite (adj) suffering (n) ashamed (adj) bacon (n)

- Diachronic corpus materials
  - diachronic balance
  - quality & documentation of corpora (e.g. Koplenig 2015)
  - English: well served, but messy in terms of varieties

- Google Books (books) only up to 2022, no concordances, only n-grams
- enTenTen (very large web-corpora), 2012, 13, 15, 18, 21 (61 billion for 2021)
- English Trends (news, Wikipedia, newsfeeds) 2014 present (84+ billion)
- Wikipedia
- BNC, BNC2014 (spoken, 11 million) 1990s & 2014
- Brown family (Brown, LOB, Frown, FLOB), 1960s & 1990, UK and USA, 1m
- **COCA** (AmE, 1990-2019)


- Google Books (books) up to 2022; allows BrE spec
- enTenTen (very large web-corpora) 2012, 13, 15, 18, 21; allow .uk spec
- English Trends (news, Wikipedia, newsfeeds) 2014 ; allows .uk spec
- Wikipedia (no clear time-depth, no variety spec)
- BNC, BNC2014 (too small)
- Brown family (Brown, LOB, Frown, FLOB), too small
- COCA (AmE)

- frequencies across time, varieties





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As the country's leaked diplomatic cables suggest, the impact of the case **going forward** could be severe.


We look forward to working with Oxfordshire County Council on important initiatives **going forward** to encourage people to travel by bus. '

English Trends (Sketch Engine) 2024 - 2025

- how new?
- S-curve?
- Formal predecessors: shifts from literal/other uses?
- Geographical origins?
- Predecessor expressions: functional equivalents?
  - Literal uses frequently in sports reporting
  - Blurring evident in going forward to next stage, next season (only secondary temporal aspect)
  - > More clearly temportal uses also occur in sports
  - > Outside sports, fewer examples of literal and 'progression' uses
  - > Frequency increase comes outside sports, and usually unambiguously temp.

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


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1980 - 2022 • British English •

- how new?
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- Formal predecessors: shifts from literal/other uses?
- Predecessor expressions: functional equivalents?
- **Grammaticalisation?** No, periphrastic future still mostly obligatory, outside sports
- Functional need or (fad) replacement/shift, filler or emphatic?
- Linguistic relativity, forced conceptualisation

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"We expect there to be lower profitability **going forward**," Ofgem Chief Executive Dermot Nolan told a conference call.

... the uncertainty is making some landlords question their viability **going forward**.

## Conclusions

- · Going forward seems
  - a more dynamic and more parsimonious replacement for *in the future*
  - · recent, but here to stay
  - an extention from spacial and procedural forwards to future, something that may have overlapped particularly in sports reporting (where fillers are also functionally useful)
  - remains pleonastic, but can serve filler as well as emphatic purposes
- · General insights for diachronic phraseology might include
  - · Fast change does occur and can lead to permanent change
  - Bleeding of genre-specific expressions into general language use
  - · Aided by filler/emphasis functions less present in alternatives
  - Aided by use of pervasive metaphor (LIFE IS A JOURNEY)
