These workshop sessions are available to all peer reviewers registered with the journal, and the guidelines are open access to all those interested.

Priding ourselves on accessible research and education, the BSDJ has begun extending its resources beyond the journal through the introduction of conference workshops. The 2024 Academy of Medical Educators Conference saw our first BSDJ open workshop, 'From Research to Publication: Maximising Your Chances of Academic Publishing'. As we continue to work towards sharing resources to support publishing for medical students and early career resident doctors, the journal has also been busy creating new opportunities for publication.

The Fulchand-Kilgour Excellence in Peer Review Award recognises the peer reviewer who conducts the greatest number of rigorous peer reviews for the respective year, as selected by the Co-Editors-in-Chief. This award celebrates the contributions of Dr. Shivali Fulchand and Dr. James Kilgour, who established the BSDJ to support the development of early career academics.

The **Julie Browne Award for Excellence in Educational Scholarship** will be awarded to the best Education paper published at the BSDJ for the respective year, as selected by the Faculty Advisory Board. Mrs Julie Browne, Honorary Editor of the BSDJ and Chair of the Faculty Advisory board, has made a profound impact on medical education through her leadership, mentorship and unwavering support for future medical educators.

Author, reader and reviewer feedback is well considered at the BSDJ. As you will notice, the 2025 issue is the start of the BSDJ's move towards an 'as-and-when' publishing style. Previously, we had seasonal issues for authors to publish through at different points in the year. However, we will now be continually publishing articles as-and-when the manuscripts complete the copyediting process. This is in response to feedback, ensuring the BSDJ adapts to the current standards in medical publishing, and is best catered to supporting our readership and authors.
